From 2015 to 2019, Mr. Meredith served as Chief Deputy General Counsel to Kentucky Governor Matt Bevin. He was in private practice at Ransdell & Roach from

2011 to 2015 and Frost Brown Todd from 2009 to 2011. Mr. Meredith served as a law clerk for Judge Amul Thapar on the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky from 2008 to 2009 and for Judge John Rogers on the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit from 2007 to 2008. He received his J.D. from the University of Kentucky College of Law in 2007 and his B.A. from Washington and Lee University in 2004.
